- If you are struggling with employment concerns or are worried about school bills, our finance manager, John Pratt, and I want to know.
- If you need other types of assistance, share those needs with people in the community who can help. If you share it with me and it is beyond my ability to help, I will try to connect you with others who are better positioned to assist.



Solutions may not always be easy to find, but we do not want anyone to feel they have to struggle alone. Together we can find our best ways forward.
